New College of Commissioners 2024-2029

- European Parliament elections June 2024
- Member States proposed candidates for new Commission in summer
- European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen provided Mission Letters to Commissioners-designate in September
- EP hearings of Commissioners-designate in November
- New College of Commissioners agreed to by EP on 27/11 and appointed by Council on 28/11 for the period 1 December 2024 - 31 October 2029
- New Commissioner for Fisheries and Oceans: Constantinos (Costas) Kadis



Mission Letter – Commissioner Kadis

All commissioners (non-exhaustive overview):

- simpler, more focused and responsive long-term budget Investment Commission
- Sustainable Development Goals European Green Deal
- Annual Implementation Dialogues with stakeholders and Youth Policy Dialogues

Specifically (non-exhaustive overview):

- Common Fisheries Policy: effective implementation, full evaluation and, if/where needed, refine and enhance

- new European Oceans Pact
- EU Ocean Research and Innovation Strategy
- Presence in EU coastal communities Fisheries and Oceans Dialogues



Evaluation of the Common Fisheries Policy (CFP) Regulation

- Evaluation objective: to provide an evidence-based assessment of whether the CFP Regulation is still fit for purpose or where lessons can be learned for improving
- Key evaluation criteria: efficiency, effectiveness, relevance, coherence, EU added value
- Public feedback was collected till 6 September on the "Have your say" portal (link)
- Public consultation will be launched by end 2024
- **Study** supporting the evaluation is being conducted by an external contractor, report expected October 2025 wide coverage
- Final product is CFP evaluation report a staff working document drafted by the Commission



Other studies and consultations

- Foresight study "Fishers of the future" launched in November 2023, report expected in December 2024
- Training and Certification of Fishers across EU coastal Member States: launched in 2024, report expected by December 2024
- Landing obligation: initiated in 2024, report expected spring 2025
- Management of EU fishing capacity: initiated in 2024, report expected by June 2025
- Common Market Organisation (CMO) provisions on consumer information and producer organisations: launched in October 2024, report expected by July 2025
- Consultations on social indicators and quota allocation (CFP Article 17) closed: ongoing assessment of responses related to Fishing Opportunities and upcoming outreach to Member States and stakeholders



EMFF and **EMFAF** evaluations

- EMFF ex-post evaluation and EMFAF mid-term evaluation in parallel
- Supported by external studies conducted over the past year
- Key evaluation criteria: efficiency, effectiveness, relevance, coherence, EU added value
- Outreach to the wider public (call for evidence, public consultation, surveys, targeted interviews and consultations, validation workshops etc.)
- Evaluation study reports expected to be finalised by end 2024
- Results of the studies and Staff Working Documents to be published in spring 2025



Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF)

- Commission to present a proposal on the next MFF Regulation by 1 July 2025
- MFF proposal determines the overall EU budget allocation, allocations to specific policy areas and main delivery models
- Changed context and focus
- Evaluation work on the EU funding and the CFP will help define the best use of the budget available in the next funding period

 - ✓ Aim: to raise awareness, understanding and acceptance of aquaculture among citizens and those who have a say at local level on the development of the sector
 - Commission will prepare tools that can be used by Member States
